Caution urged as Gwynedd's economy reopens safely

Gwynedd Council has issued a press release following the relaxation of the Covid-19 regulations encouraging those aiming to visit to do so in a cautious manner, to plan ahead and to treat our communities with respect. At present, people from other parts of Wales can visit Gwynedd, but of course it is not possible to travel in or out of Wales until 12 April 2021 at the earliest. Gwynedd Council and its partners have been working closely over the last few months to prepare for such a situation. These preparations are intended to help keep the people of Gwynedd, and those who choose to visit the county, safe, and cover a range of areas. Moving Wales into Alert Level 3: First Minister sets out plans to further relax COVID restrictions

Yesterday, 31 March 2021, the First Minister of Wales, Mark Drakeford, set out a series of measures that will take Wales fully into Alert Level 3 by 17 May 2021, subject to public health conditions remaining favourable. For the press release in full, go to:

The key points for businesses are:

- From 12 April 2021:
 - All remaining non-essential retail and close contact services will be allowed to reopen
 - Travel into and out of Wales from the rest of the United Kingdom and Common Travel Area will be allowed
- From 26 April 2021 (to be confirmed at the 22 April 2021 review, subject to public health conditions and final confirmation by Ministers)
 Outdoor attractions to reopen
 Outdoor hospitality to reopen, including at cafes, pubs and restaurants
- Early May 2021
 - Plans to allow organised outdoor activities for up to 30 people to take place including wedding receptions
 - Plans to allow gyms, leisure centres and fitness facilities to reopen for individual or one-to-one training but not exercise classes
