Wales moves to Alert Level 2

The Welsh Government has confirmed today that Wales will move into Alert Level 2 on Monday 17 May 2021. The changes to the coronavirus restrictions include:

- Indoor hospitality can re-open 6 people from up to 6 households (not including children under 11) can book
- All holiday accommodation can re-open fully
- Entertainment venues, including cinemas, bingo halls, bowling alleys, indoor-play centres and areas, casinos, amusement arcades, and theatres can re-open. Cinemas, theatres concert halls and sports grounds can sell food and drink as long as it is consumed in a seated area for watching the performance
- Indoor visitor attractions, including museums and galleries can re-open
- Up to 30 people can take part in organised indoor activities and up to 50 people in organised outdoor activities. This includes wedding receptions and wakes.

Latest advice

IMPORTANT: It will remain compulsory for hospitality businesses (including pubs, bars, cafes and restaurants) to collect the details of staff, customers and visitors and keep this information in a safe place for 21 days. Displaying a NHS App QR code on its own doesn't comply with the rules. The names, contact telephone numbers and a record of the date and arrival time of everyone (over 18) must be collected

Further financial support for businesses

The Welsh Government has announced that further financial support will be provided to help those businesses which remain affected by restrictions to meet ongoing costs through to the end of June 2021 as they prepare for reopening and more normal trading conditions.

Businesses that stand to benefit include:

- Nightclubs and late entertainment venues
- Events and conference venues not covered by the Welsh Government's Cultural Recovery Fund (CRF)
- Hospitality and leisure businesses, including restaurants, pubs and cafés
- Supply chain business, which have been materially impacted by restrictions

An eligibility checker will open on the Business Wales website at midday on 17 May 2021. Businesses will be able submit applications by the end of the month and they will receive between £2,500 and £25,000 depending on their circumstances. Funding will be based on the size of the business and the restrictions they are under. For more information, go to:
