Relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions – updated timetable

The Welsh Government has confirmed further relaxations will be brought forward from 17 May 2021 to 3 May 2021 moving Wales to Alert Level 3 by Monday 3 May 2021.

Key dates and points for business are:

Saturday 24 April 2021:

Rule of 6 will allow for up to six people from six households to meet outdoors, not including children under 11 years of age or carers from those households

Monday 26 April 2021:

- Outdoor attractions, including funfairs and theme parks, would be allowed to reopen
- Outdoor hospitality can resume, including at cafes, pubs and restaurants. (Indoor hospitality will remain closed except for takeaways)
- Organised outdoor activities for up to 30 people can again take place (previously Monday 3 May 2021)

Wedding receptions can take place outdoors for up to 30 people (previously Monday 3 May 2021)

Monday 3 May 2021

- Gyms, leisure centres and fitness facilities can reopen. This will include individual or one-to-one training but not exercise classes
- Extended household will again allow two households to meet and have contact indoors (there are no guidelines yet on how this will impact self-contained accommodation)

Relaxations planned for 17 May 2021 will be brought forward to 3 May 2021, including:

- The resumption of indoor supervised activities for children
- Indoor organised activities for up to 15 adults (such as exercise classes and swimming lessons)
- Re-opening of community centres

The Gwynedd Active Travel project focuses on 12 towns in Gwynedd – Bangor, Y Felinheli, Bethesda, Caernarfon, Pwllheli, Porthmadog, Tremadog, Blaenau Ffestiniog, Bala, Dolgellau, Barmouth and Tywyn.
