Plastic-Free Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon) Survey

Share Impact & Travel Without Plastic, have been commissioned by Snowdonia National Park Authority to conduct a scoping study to explore the possibility of creating a Plastic Free Mountain Status for Yr Wyddfa (Snowdon) and Snowdonia National Park. The Snowdon Partnership has tasked Share Impact with exploring:

If a Plastic Free Mountain Status is possible and what this might look like (this would be the first of its kind in Europe)

And within this to explore options to:

reduce the amount of litter – particularly single use plastics left in the area

- reduce the plastic and micro-plastic pollution in the region
- influence behavioural change regarding plastic pollution towards this precious region
