Purpose of the annual report:

The aim of the Annual Report is to assist the electorate to become better informed of the work and activities of their elected local authority member during the year.

Role and responsibilities:

Representing the community interest in Gwynedd Council. Representing the Council on outside bodies.

Constituency activities:

As Vice Chairman of the Hospital Appeal Fund committee and working with the project group, we were successful in attracting over £5 million pounds towards a new primary care centre and 16 bed wards at Tywyn Hospital and the work will hopefully be completed before the end of 2015.

The Appeal Committee have also given over £100,000 towards a new x-ray unit and refurbishment of the room.

As Chairman of the Governing body of Ysgol Penybryn, we have recently completed a new hall and upgrading of all the classrooms at a total cost of over £1.8 million. Also finance was secured for work at Ysgol Uwchradd Tywyn.

Had various meetings with Gwynedd officers, the AM Dafydd Elis Thomas and MP Elfyn Llwyd concerning constituency matters. Had a joint meeting with NRW and AM and Gwynedd Consultancy following the storms in January.

Other initiatives and activities:

Attended monthly Town Council meetings, and the various sub meetings. As Chairman of the Ynysymaengwyn Trust we were successful in gaining the Green Flag Award for the Park again this year.

Met with the Minister John Griffiths AM earlier this year for him to see the important link to the Costal Path of the new Tonfannau bridge, a project which I had been involved in with the Tywyn Partnership for many years. The cycle route between Tywyn and Aberdyfi has been started but unfortunately at the moment there is no money to complete the work.

As Chairman of Mid Wales Tourism since 2001 and Director of Tourism Partnership Mid Wales, I have constant meetings with Politicians and the Visit Wales team to ensure that the whole area benefits economically from tourism.

As treasurer of the local branch of the NSPCC since 1989, last year we raised over £2k in the area, and as treasure of the Meirionnydd Urdd Appeal, raised over £6,000.
