The present plan does not identify an area available for the additional 6 units required.

In fairness to the community it is necessary therefore to include the area outlined in the attached Plan 2 back as part of the village as it has always been.

Please see attachments 1,2 & 3.

Llanddaniel Fab is a predominantly Welsh speaking community. There is an excellent Welsh medium Primary School (current number of pupils 110); a Welsh medium Pre School Nursery; Shop; Post Office; Community Centre (which has just won £5000 in a competition 'Trigolion' to make improvements to these amenities); a well equipped Play Ground; and a frequent Bus Service.

Within a mile and a half of Llanddaniel Fab is a Medical Centre; Dental Practice; Supermarket; Department Store; 2 Cafes; Train Station; Petrol Station and Garage.

All of these are within easier reach than similar facilities are for many housing areas in Urban or Regional Centres.

Within 5 miles there are a General Hospital, (with a bus service running directly from Llanddaniel Fab); Police Station; Secondary School; University; Public Library; Optician; and Transport Hub - Train and Bus Stations.

The site at Yr Hen Ficerdy is at the heart of the village community.

The Bus Service runs directly from this site in both the direction of Llanfairpwll, Menai Bridge and Bangor, and in the other direction to Gaerwen, Llangefni, and Holyhead.

There is a pavement and street lighting directly from this site to the Primary School (300 metres) and to the Post Office, Shop, Play Ground, and both Community Centres.

There are 2 existing points of access onto the highway.

All essential services - Water, Mains Drainage, Electricity e.t.c are already on site.

In accordance with the requirements of Policy TA 117, including this site in the LDP would enable the local community to sustain and strengthen the Welsh language and cultural traditions of this rural area. This is a characteristically Welsh community and in order to continue as such it is essential to allow young families whose relatives already live here, and whose roots are in this community to have affordable homes here themselves.

There is a real and demonstrable Local Need for these 6 additional houses in order to keep our young people here, and to maintain the rural community character of Llanddaniel Fab.

Is the Plan a Sound one if it ignores these Local Needs?

Unless these Local Needs are addressed and fulfilled the essential services which maintain community life - Bus Services, School, Post Office, Shop e.t.c. and with them the Community Activities which are part of rural life will be lost from the Welsh villages.

This is my community - a Welsh village, and my children and my neighbour's children, and their children have a right to live and to grow up in their native environment.
