Action Point 42 (S16/PG42) – Proposal and Constraint Maps

1. Amend the proposal maps to include the Special Landscape Area
2. Amend the proposal maps to include the Minerals Safeguarding Area
3. Amend the online mapping system (proposal and constraint maps)
4. Consider how the information on the constraint maps is shown

Council's response

1. As a result of the Matters Arising Change to Policy AMG1 the Special Landscape Areas will be shown on the Proposal Maps as opposed to the Constraints Maps. The Matters Arising Change Schedule (which will be subject to the public consultation) will confirm this and will show the extent of the information layer which will need to be moved from one place to another. The hard and interactive copy of the final Plan will include this change.
2. As a result of the Matters Arising Change to Policy MWYN1 the Mineral safeguarding Areas will be shown on the Proposal Maps as opposed to the Constraints Maps. The Matters Arising Change Schedule (which will be subject to the public consultation) will confirm this and will show the extent of the information layer which will need to be moved from one place to another. The hard and interactive copy of the final Plan will include this change.
3. The interactive version of the Proposal and Constraint Maps have been reviewed and measures have been taken to ensure that not all of the layers automatically load, meaning that the viewer has to manually choose which layer or layers is relevant for them. This amendment means that the information loads quicker and is much more accessible for individuals who want to review the maps.
4. As a result of all the information which is shown on the Proposal and Constraint Maps, further consideration needs to be given to the way in which information is presented, specifically with regard to the paper version of the Plan. The Councils will arrange for the Maps of the Plan area to be further subdivided into sub-areas ensuring that the information presented is more visible and that the scale of the Plan is more detailed. Further, the appearance of the layers i.e. colour and style will be refined. This will ensure that the final version of the Plan is clear and easy to read. An example of the revised version of the map will be made available for the Inspectors consideration in due course.
