Tourism and Hospitality Businesses: keep your staff, customers and the community safe

Thanks for all your efforts as you've reopened, we've had some great feedback about the work you're doing. Here are a few top tips from the Council's Public Protection Teams after the bank holiday weekend:

- Remember marquees and other temporary structures should be open on at least 3 sides
- It's compulsory for hospitality businesses (including pubs, bars, cafes and restaurants) to collect the details of staff, customers and visitors and keep this information in a safe place for 21 days. Displaying a NHS App QR code on its own doesn't comply with the rules. The names, contact telephone numbers and a record of the date and arrival time of everyone (over 18) must be collected
- To stop people congregating and make it easier to collect contact information stick to advance bookings if you can
- Entry to beer gardens needs to be controlled and these spaces should be supervised just like indoors

There are some great checklists available in poster format to support the Guidance for Tourism and Hospitality businesses, which outline the key measures you should implement to keep your staff, customers and visitors safe.
